

Rules and Regulations

Disclaimer: the rules and regulations differ according to the track you apply please ensure you refer to the set of rules and regulations that apply to the track your team is planning to register for.

01. Teams will be given a maximum time of 10 minutes, 5 minutes for pitching and 5 minutes for any Q&A from the judges on the Initial Pitch day.
02. A minimum attendance of 75% of the team should be present throughout the Initial Pitch & Workshop. Inability to do so can cause disqualification or deductions in the final marks.
03. Each team is expected to present a Minimum Viable Product (MVP) on the final day.
04. The idea submitted by the team during registration can in no means be changed after registrations are over.
05. Teams can seek advice & support from the available mentors during the Mentorship day.
06. Participating teams are expected to cover all expenses related to travelling and accommodation.
07. Teams are expected to bring all relevant devices they need such as laptops, mobile phones, dongles, routers, extension cords, pen drive (with the presentation deck) and any other necessary items.
08. Participating teams are advised to check their emails regularly in order to receive notifications and stay up to date about the event.
09. The use of data science should be incorporated into the project.
10. All ideas should be novel and innovative.
11. All teams should adhere to the Proposal Format.
12. Please note that any damage done to any physical property present in the location of the event will be held responsible by the respective personnel.
13. Please ensure that you hold possession of any identification material (NIC or Passport) to identify yourself apart from the ID tags provided.

14. Teams will be required to pitch & demonstrate for 8 minutes. 5 minutes will be provided for the Q/A session at the Finale.

15. Note that judges' decision will be final and irrevocable.

16. Participating team members are required to be available at the Respective premises 15 minutes before the recognized time for participation. Please refrain from carrying additional bags and other extra materials than the required level, because of security measures.

IIT Track

Teams must comprise of 4 to 6 members.

External Track

01. Teams must comprise of 3 to 4 members.

02. Undergraduates of any University or Higher Educational Institute are eligible to participate in this competition.

03. As this is not an inter-university hackathon, teams can be formed with members from different universities.

04. The proposed project should be grouped into the most suitable category from the categories mentioned below at the time of registration :

- Good Health and well being
- Quality Education
- Clean Water and Sanitation
- Affordable and clean energy
- Decent work and economic growth
- Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure
- Sustainable Cities and Communities
- Responsible Consumption and production
- Climate Action
